Dear Campaign Finance Division:

I am a qualified voter registered in Maricopa County and an SRP ratepayer. I am writing to file a formal complaint regarding potential coordination between the four candidates on the "Elected Leadership for SRP" slate and Turning Point Action ("TPA"), a 501(c)(4) organization, in potential violation of A.R.S. Sec. 16-922. The candidates are:

- **Christopher J. Dobson**, candidate for SRP Board President (Committee 1002039)
- **Barry Pacey**, candidate for SRP Board Vice-President
- **Rusty Kennedy**, candidate for SRP Board Governor, District 12
- **Kelly Cooper**, candidate for SRP Board Governor, District 14

I. Legal Framework

Arizona Revised Statutes Sec. 16-922 governs the distinction between independent expenditures and coordinated expenditures in candidate elections.

Under A.R.S. Sec. 16-922, an independent expenditure is one that is NOT made "in cooperation or consultation with or at the request or suggestion of the candidate or the candidate's agent."

An expenditure is considered coordinated if there is "actual coordination with respect to an expenditure between a candidate or candidate's agent and the person making the expenditure."

The statute establishes rebuttable evidence of coordination, including: "any agent of the person making the expenditure is also an agent of the candidate."

The consequence of a finding of coordination is significant: "An expenditure that is coordinated with a candidate... is deemed an in-kind contribution to the candidate."

The statute does provide a firewall defense. Coordination does NOT exist if the expenditure maker maintains: (1) a written policy establishing a firewall, (2) the agent did not participate in expenditure decisions, and (3) both parties followed the policy.

II. Evidence of Coordination

Evidence Item 1: TPA Email Addresses for All Four Candidates

All four candidates on the "Elected Leadership for SRP" slate have organizational email addresses on TPA's domain (@tpaction.com), as confirmed in TPA's content management system:

These are Turning Point Action organizational email addresses. Each requires provisioning by TPA's IT administration, implies acceptance of TPA's acceptable use policies, and means TPA has administrative access to each candidate's communications on that domain. This is not an endorsement relationship. This is organizational integration across the entire slate.

Evidence Item 2: TPA Bio Pages for All Four Candidates

All four candidates have official bio pages hosted on TPA's website:

- tpaction.com/bio/chrisdobson (title: "President")
- tpaction.com/bio/barrypaceley (title: "Vice-President")
- tpaction.com/bio/rustykennedy (title: "District 12 - Board Governor")
- tpaction.com/bio/kellycooper (title: "District 14 - Board Governor")

Each page lists the candidate's SRP candidacy title, not a TPA organizational title. Each candidate's profile photo is hosted on TPA's content delivery network (cdn.tpaction.com). These are not endorsement listings. They are staff or leadership profile pages, identical in format and placement to TPA's organizational leadership profiles. The existence of these pages for all four slate candidates suggests the entire slate is integrated into TPA's organizational structure.

Evidence Item 3: Coordinated Batch Onboarding

All four candidate profiles in TPA's content management system were created on the same day (January 13, 2026) with sequential profile IDs:

Sequential profile IDs created on the same date indicate a coordinated batch onboarding process, not four independent endorsement decisions made over time. All four profiles were set up in a single administrative session.

Additionally, the "endorsed" field in TPA's CMS is set to FALSE for all four candidates. TPA's own system does not classify these individuals as endorsees. They are stored as organizational profiles.

All four bio pages include a "noindex" directive in their robots meta tags, instructing search engines not to index the pages. TPA is actively preventing public discovery of these candidate profiles through search engines while continuing to use them operationally.

Evidence Item 4: Campaign Website Infrastructure

The "Elected Leadership for SRP" campaign website (electedleadershipforsrp.com) coordinates the full four-candidate slate. Campaign materials on the site read: "Paid for by Chris Dobson for SRP President and Barry Pacey for SRP VP."

The same slate is endorsed and promoted by TPA at tpaction.com/srpendorsements. The messaging, branding, and candidate selection are identical across the campaign operation and TPA's promotion of that operation. The overlap in slate composition, messaging, and presentation raises the question of whether the campaign and TPA's expenditures were developed independently or in consultation with one another.

No candidate on the slate maintains an independent campaign website. The only web presence for any of the four candidates is the shared electedleadershipforsrp.com domain.

Evidence Item 5: Candidate Committee vs. Actual Campaign Operation

Dobson's candidate committee (Committee 1002039) reports raising \$5,000 and spending \$0 through December 31, 2025, the date of the last filed report. The Q1 2026 report covering January through March is due during the April 1-15 filing window and has not yet been filed. Campaign signs reading "Paid for by Chris Dobson for SRP President" appeared across the Phoenix metropolitan area during that Q1 period.

Regardless of what the Q1 report ultimately shows, the scale disparity remains significant. Dobson's committee has raised \$5,000 total. Meanwhile, TPA has spent what its leadership describes as "millions" supporting this same slate, deploying "hundreds of staff" for voter

contact and campaign operations. A candidate committee of this size cannot independently sustain the on-the-ground campaign operation that has been deployed in support of this slate.

If TPA's campaign infrastructure was provided in coordination with the candidates, those expenditures constitute unreported in-kind contributions under A.R.S. Sec. 16-922.

Evidence Item 6: Dobson's Role in Slate Formation

According to AZCentral reporting published April 4, 2026, fellow candidate Barry Pacey indicated that Chris Dobson, the SRP presidential candidate, recruited him to run as his vice president, and that he and Dobson reviewed all the hopefuls and selected them carefully.

Pacey also stated he was "pleased that Turning Point supports his cause" but had grown accustomed to "reassuring people that his campaign is independent from Turning Point."

The fact that Dobson recruited Pacey and built the slate, while TPA simultaneously deployed millions of dollars in resources for the same slate, raises the question of who is directing the campaign strategy. If Dobson is selecting the candidates and TPA is funding the operation to elect them, the degree of separation required for independent expenditure status may not exist.

Evidence Item 7: Candidate Silence and AZFRG Admission

Not a single candidate on the "Elected Leadership for SRP" slate has made any public statement explaining their relationship with TPA. Despite each candidate having an organizational email address and bio page within TPA's infrastructure, none has publicly acknowledged or described this arrangement.

Meanwhile, Arizonans for Responsible Growth (AZFRG), a political action committee that has spent \$211,000 or more supporting the slate, has been more forthcoming. AZFRG chair Jimmy Lindblom has referred to TPA leaders as "strong allies" and stated that they collaborate on "registering voters and using similar messaging."

This admission of collaboration on voter registration and messaging between AZFRG and TPA, combined with the candidates' complete silence about their own TPA integration, raises additional questions about the nature and extent of coordination across these organizations.

Evidence Item 8: Pacey Financial Ties to AZFRG

Barry Pacey's company, Pacey Constructors, donated \$1,000 or more to AZFRG. AZFRG subsequently spent \$211,000 or more in support of the slate that includes Pacey's candidacy for SRP Vice-President.

This creates a financial loop: a candidate's business entity funds a PAC, and that PAC then

spends over two hundred times that amount supporting that candidate's slate. This financial relationship further undermines the claim that the various organizational expenditures supporting this slate are independent of the candidates.

Evidence Item 9: Unreported In-Kind Contributions to Slate Candidates

Kelly Cooper and Rusty Kennedy do not appear to have registered candidate committees with either Maricopa County or the Arizona Secretary of State for the 2026 SRP election. Barry Paceley's candidate committee (Committee 1000572) reports only \$1,500 in loans and \$862 in in-kind contributions.

Yet all four candidates appear on campaign signs deployed across the Phoenix metropolitan area. Signs reading "Paid for by Chris Dobson for SRP President" promote not just Dobson but the full "Elected Leadership for SRP" slate, including the district candidates. Separately, signs reading "Paid for by Turning Point PAC" also promote all four candidates.

Under A.R.S. Sec. 16-901, campaign materials such as signs that promote a candidate and are paid for by another entity constitute in-kind contributions to that candidate. Under A.R.S. Sec. 16-905, a candidate who receives contributions exceeding \$1,500 must register a candidate committee within 10 days of crossing that threshold.

The fair market value of a metro-wide sign campaign promoting four candidates would very likely exceed the \$1,500 threshold for each candidate individually. If Cooper and Kennedy are receiving signs promoting their candidacies -- whether paid for by Dobson's committee or by Turning Point PAC -- those signs are in-kind contributions that should trigger committee registration and financial reporting obligations.

The absence of any registered committee or financial disclosure from Cooper and Kennedy, despite being promoted on signs across the metro area, suggests one of two things: either (a) they are receiving unreported in-kind contributions in excess of the registration threshold, or (b) these candidates are operating entirely within TPA's infrastructure without any independent campaign apparatus. Either scenario raises serious compliance concerns.

III. Firewall Analysis

Under A.R.S. Sec. 16-922, coordination does NOT exist if the person making the expenditure maintains a written firewall policy, the shared agent did not participate in expenditure decisions, and both parties followed the policy.

However, the following facts cut against the existence of an adequate firewall:

1. There is no public evidence that TPA has established a written firewall policy governing its SRP election spending.

2. All four candidates on the slate use TPA email addresses (@tpaction.com). A firewall requires separation; shared email infrastructure across an entire slate requires the opposite. TPA has administrative access to the communications of every candidate it is purportedly supporting independently.

3. All four candidates maintain official bio pages within TPA's website, formatted as organizational profiles rather than endorsement listings, with their "endorsed" status set to FALSE in TPA's own CMS. A firewall is designed to preserve an arm's-length relationship. Organizational integration of an entire slate is inconsistent with that purpose.

4. All four candidate profiles were created on the same day with sequential IDs, indicating a coordinated onboarding process. A firewall contemplates that the expenditure maker and the candidate operate independently. Batch-processing an entire slate into the organization's infrastructure on a single day suggests the opposite.

5. The bio pages are set to "noindex," actively hiding them from search engines. If the relationship between TPA and these candidates were a straightforward endorsement, there would be no reason to prevent public discovery of the endorsement pages.

6. No candidate has made any public statement about their relationship with TPA, despite each being integrated into TPA's infrastructure. This silence is inconsistent with the transparency that a functioning firewall is intended to provide.

7. If a written firewall policy does exist, TPA and the candidates should be required to produce it in response to this complaint so that its adequacy can be evaluated.

IV. Requested Action

I respectfully request that the Campaign Finance Division take the following actions:

1. **Investigate** whether Turning Point Action's expenditures in support of the "Elected Leadership for SRP" slate constitute coordinated expenditures under A.R.S. Sec. 16-922.

2. **Determine** whether, if coordination is found, TPA's expenditures should be treated as in-kind contributions to Dobson's candidate committee (Committee 1002039) and to the other slate candidates' committees.

3. **Determine** whether the candidate committees have failed to report in-kind contributions from TPA in violation of Arizona campaign finance reporting requirements.

4. **Request** that TPA produce any written firewall policy it maintains pursuant to A.R.S. Sec. 16-922(B).

5. **Investigate** whether Kelly Cooper and Rusty Kennedy have met their candidate committee registration obligations under A.R.S. Sec. 16-905, given that campaign signs promoting their candidacies have been paid for by other entities at a scale that would likely exceed the \$1,500 contribution threshold.

6. **Advise** me as to what additional information or documentation would be helpful to

support this complaint.

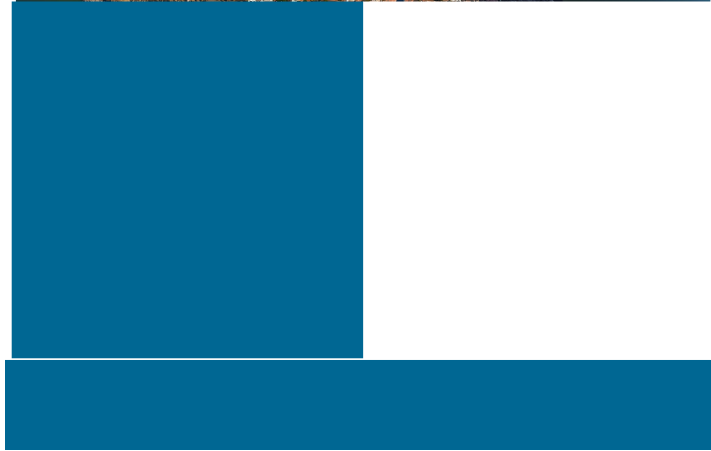
